
Halam's Flower Displays

Matters Arising from Previous Meeting

A. alterations to Standing Orders - adopted

- B. alterations to HR Standing Committee Terms of reference adopted
- C. first aid training awaiting information from W.I.
- D. churchyard bench cost of brass plaque agreed

Finance

Agreed to pay:

- 1. village hall cleaner
- 2. backpay for clerk
- 3. Cost of NALC meeting biodiversity

The quarterly budget information was circulated.

Village Hall

Clerk to check the cleaner's public liability insurance.

Allotments

The new allotment holder is clearing and cleaning up the two allotments they have taken on. Agreed not to charge them this year. Some old tyres are being used as planters; these must be removed if the holder gives up the allotment. Clerk to write to holders to confirm this.

Clerk to check allotment agreement and amend to cover any future tyre removal requirements.

The title claim is in progress.

Roads & Hedges

Crossroads fingerpost – previous decision (to have a concrete post for the sign) was taken in April. This will stand until November (six months); to discussed again at that time.

Parking on School Lane – a letter has been received from the Head of Halam School. The staff and parents will be asked to park more considerately. Clerk will speak to Halam Salon to ensure that any of their cars do not create obstruction as well.

The trees overhanging Halam Hill still require cutting back - Clerk to pursue with County Council Highways.

Harvest Supper

After further discussion it was felt that trying to arrange some sort of joint celebration with the church, W.I. and Young Farmers wasn't workable.

A Harvest Celebration Afternoon Tea was proposed on **Sunday 12th October from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.** in the village hall, with a cash bar.

Village Christmas Tree

Putting a Christmas tree on the verge outside the church will be problematic as County Council Highways will need plans and details for approval. After discussion it was decided that the church verge was not really suitable and a larger tree outside the village hall was proposed.

Community Protection Officer

The area's CPO will be attending the 11th September parish council meeting to discuss local policing matters. He will answer questions from the public.

Tours of Britain

There seems to be some confusion over the route of this in September, but it appears that they will NOT be coming through Halam.

Website Review

On transfer of the website to Halam parish council the domain name will change, but that should not affect any searches for "Halam village".

Correspondence

The NALC AGM will be on 15th October – Chris Denyer to attend as Halam parish council's voting representative.

Lengthsman Scheme

The quote received to clear the weeds under, and then paint the railings along Halam Beck on the Turnpike was discussed. It was agreed that the brief given for the work needed revisiting – the soil and silt needs removing as well as the weeds. The quality and cost of paint to be used was also discussed. It was also essential that anyone undertaking the work should be insured. The Clerk to discuss further with the individual who had sent in the quote.

Planning

1. Pepperbox Cottage, School Lane

<u>Variation of Condition 2, Condition 3 & Condition 4 of PP 20/00311/FUL Householder application for erection of a two-storey extension with single-storey projection at the back, creation of a new main entrance with a porch and internal associated works, relocation of the drive to the north-west corner of the site and replacement of single garage with a double garage.</u>

The applicant has applied to increase the size of a double garage (already approved) by adding a carport: approved unanimously.

2. Land Off St Michael's Close, Halam

Application for permission in principle for residential development of four or nine dwellings

This application was received too late for the agenda this month. As the deadline for comments is 29th August, although comments may be considered if received before the decision date of 6th September. This application will be discussed at an additional parish council meeting on Thursday 28th August.

Matters Arising from Previous Meeting

- 1. The Clerk reported that his back-pay had not been received. He asked that this be put on next meeting's agenda.
- 2. Andrew Paris showed the new V.E. commemoration plaque for the new churchyard bench. He will fit this and the old plaque in place shortly.

Open Meeting

A number of parishioners attended the meeting and expressed their concerns about, and objections to the Application for permission in principle for residential development on land off St Michaels Close.

Planning

Land Off St Michaels Close: Application for permission in principle for residential development of four or nine dwellings

The clerk reported that a number of written objections had been received.

Councillors agreed on a form of wording to be sent to NSDC Planning department in response to the application for permission in principle, including concerns about road safety, increased flood risk, biodiversity and non-compliance with NSDC's own policies and core strategies.

Lengthsman Scheme

Councillors were updated on progress with securing contractors, and it was agreed to employ specialist contractors for clearing weeds and silt and then painting the roadside railings.

Harvest Celebration - Sunday 12th October from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. in the village hall

Andrew Paris has had the flyers printed and these will be distributed to each household. A traditional 'Afternoon Tea' menu will be circulated to councillors for agreement and budgeting. It was agreed to ask for volunteers to make apple pies and crumbles to be included on the menu. This will be a free tea with a cash bar to be organised.
